





From a childhood in a small coastal Australian town, to reveling in Sydney's dangerous underworld as a naïve young artist, to chasing his dreams of acting in vaudeville in New York where he became involved with the mob and an aspiring English actor who would become one of the biggest movie stars of all time, Orry's life is a wild and exciting ride! A ride that led him to Hollywood and a career spanning 30 years, designing costumes and gowns for 285 films including 42nd Street, Casablanca, The Maltese Falcon, Oklahoma and Jezebel, he won Oscars for An American in Paris, Les Girls and Some Like It Hot and a further nomination for Gypsy. Had there been an Oscar category for Costume design before 1948 – who knows how many more statuettes he may have claimed.









In New York, 1926, Orry took in a young English stilt walker from Coney Island named Archie Leach. Archie stayed with Orry for the next 5 years, creating a handmade tie business, working as an escort and opening a speak easy together, before they both headed to Hollywood and Archie became ... Cary Grant – the biggest star in motion pictures of his time.




